Dear Parents/Carers

Our big building is back alive once again with the happy chatter of our 472 children, albeit with some changes from when we left in March. As I have already said, the children have coped extremely well with our new routines and systems, which has been incredible.

We are continuing to evaluate the school day as the safety and well being of pupils and staff is our number one priority. The whole staff team are a part of this process and all have a role to play in ensuring the smooth operation of our school day. A massive 'Thank You' for the patience, flexibility and commitment shown. It's been a challenging start to a new term, but the team spirit and dedication continues to flourish in Woodside.

We are trying where possible to ensure all children remain within their 'class bubble' throughout the day. We introduced class zones within the playground and our split playtimes and lunchtimes for the P1-3 and P4-7 pupils. This reduces numbers outside and allows classmates to stay in their zones at break times. We use the gym hall for packed lunches, giving us enough space to accommodate 'class bubbles' for both school dinners and packed lunches too!

The children are frequently washing their hands throughout the day and extra sanitising stations are positioned throughout the building The children can access these at any time.

The staggered start and end to the day, and the use of the three school gates is helping greatly to reduce the amount of people gathering around the school. This was always going to be a challenge in Woodside with our large numbers and very limited space outside however we believe this is working as smoothly as it can. We know this is difficult when your children are starting and finishing at different times, but please know that we do appreciate your patience and support at this challenging time.

This week the children have completed a return to school questionnaire in class. This will allow us to gather how they feel being back in school and what they thought of the new routines in Woodside. As always, they gave their teachers honest answers! You can read some of their comments at the end of this newsletter We emailed out a parental questionnaire on your Parent Pay account, please take a few minutes to read and return back to us. This will let us know how you as parents/carers are feeling about school being back and how we can support our families moving forward.

Our Recovery Curriculum Rationale - Stage 1

It's not just the routines in our school that have changed. As the children have not been with us since March we need to assess where they are in their learning and think carefully about the curriculum we are delivering. It can't be business as normal and we don't expect the children to pick up where they left off. We want to ensure our children settle back into school life and that they are ready to start learning again. This process is going to take some time as teachers need to build relationships, connect with their class and respond to their learning needs. To help you understand what we are covering in school at the moment, I have outlined a brief summary of our Recovery Curriculum Plan.

At present, in line with government guidelines, our priorities are :- Literacy, Numeracy and Health and Well-Being. We are initially focussing on the core skills in these areas at all stages throughout school.

In Literacy the focus is on :- Reading skills, comprehension, phonics and de coding of words

- Writing skills, pencil control, sentence structure
- Talking and Listening skills, turn taking, asking questions

In Numeracy the focus is on :- Number properties, Number sequences and + - ÷ x

In Health and Well-being the focus is on :- Mental and emotional well being

Physical well being

Physical Education will take place outdoors. For this reason we are happy for your child to wear joggers or leggings along with their school sweater for PE. Obviously, this will be weather dependent!

As we are in our recovery phase the children will not be receiving the whole curriculum yet. However, we asked them to vote on which subjects they would like. The two most popular were :- Science and ICT.

Miss Officer, Mrs Faloon, Mrs Aitcheson and Mr Williamson will deliver these areas when they are in classes each week.

Our Recovery Curriculum will be continually monitored and I will keep you updated with progress and changes.

Google Classroom

Throughout lockdown we used 'Google Classroom' as a way of delivering online learning and remaining in contact with all our children. This will continue to be our contingency plan if ever needed. You will receive your child's username and a generic password which <u>YOU MUST</u> change. This will be in their school bag tonight along with a help sheet. Please can I ask all parents and children to log in to ensure they can access this from home. If you require any support or have issues with the log in please email:- gw14woodsidepsict@glow.sch.uk

As all jotters and reading books going home have to be quarantined for 72 hours on their return to school, teachers, where they can will use 'Google Classroom' to set homework tasks. Over the next few weeks teachers will start to post short tasks to be completed at home, to help support their classes re engage with this way of working. Not all homework can be completed online and in infant classes, a different approach will be necessary. More information about this will follow soon. Please make sure your child knows their new password and has it noted somewhere safe, like their pencil case or a notebook in their bag.
