## Our Recovery Curriculum Rationale - Stage 2

Now that our children are all settled back into school life, we will be carrying out brief assessments to help us establish the next steps in their learning. In line with Government guidelines, at present our priorities continue to be :- Literacy, Numeracy and Health and Well-Being. Following the updated guidance, Physical Education can now take place **indoors**. Each class will now get **one indoor and one outdoor PE slot per week**. We are still happy for your child to wear joggers or leggings along with their school sweater for PE. Obviously, this will be weather dependent! As we are still in our recovery phase, the teachers are focusing on Literacy, Numeracy and Health and Well-Being, however along with Science and ICT we will now introduce a Social Studies topic which I'm sure the children will really enjoy.

### Emotion Works

The children and staff have now looked in more detail at some of the Emotion Works cogs. They have expanded their vocabulary about emotions through the orange cog, used the green cog to link the behaviours they might show for these emotions and the sensations their bodies might feel on the inside through the red cog. We are looking forward to the next fortnight where we will look more closely at the yellow 'triggers' cog and the blue 'regulations' cog. Please ask your child about what they have been doing in class.



### Wellies

As our playground becomes wet and dirty we appreciate that wellies are not the most comfortable shoes to wear all day in school. To help you can now provide your child with a pair of gym shoes to change into in school. Please ensure your child is able to do this independently. Many thanks!



**Absence rates** We always monitor our absences across the school and will get in touch with you by letter if your **child's rate drops** or if they are **often late** for school. The table below highlights the importance of being in school. At this time if periods off are for self isolation, pupils will not be sent an attendance letter.

<b>100%</b>	<b>0 days missed</b>	Best possible chance of success and reaching full potential
<b>95%</b>	<b>9 Days of Absence</b> 1 week and 4 days learning missed	Is likely to make it harder to achieve full potential and secure the best possible outcomes
<b>90%</b>	<b>19 days of Absence</b> 3 weeks and 4 days of learning missed	
<b>85%</b>	<b>27 Days of Absence</b> 5 weeks and 3 days of Learning Missed Almost half a term missed	Is likely to impact significantly on learning and progress which can lead to poorer outcomes in achievement, wellbeing and social and emotional development
<b>80%</b>	<b>36 days of Absence</b> 7 weeks and 3 days of learning missed Half of a term missed
