Parental Guide—Update and changes

First, I need to say a massive 'Thank you' to every parent for working in partnership with us by using the correct gates for the drop off and pick ups. I appreciate that this is not ideal for many of you however, this system is in place to reduce our numbers at peak times.

As of Monday, when we **all** return, I am aware the areas outside the school are going to be very busy. Therefore, can I please ask that you do not arrive before your child's starting time. Also, if coming to a gate can you drop off and then move on. This will ensure everyone is safe and able to socially distance. Thank you!

At 8.45am can P2 and P3 parents drop off first then go. At 9am, Primary 4-7 parents drop off and go. After 9am and once the playground is cleared the Primary 1 children will be able to enter.

At 2.45pm Primary 2 and 3 parents should arrive first and collect their children, then move off. At 3pm, Primary 4-7 parents arrive and pick up and go. Finally, Primary 1 parents will be able to enter once the playground is cleared.

At the end of the day we are looking to use some of the space in the top car park for parents collecting at the Merc Garage. Please can I kindly ask that you don't stand on their property or allow the children to play on their wall. Thank you.

After our first few days we have decided to change our lunch arrangement so as of Monday 17th August our lunch times will be as follows:-

11.50am-12.35pm for Primary 1,2 and 3 children

12.45pm-1.30pm for Primary 4,5,6 and 7 children.

There will be no afternoon break.
