#### Place2Be

My name is Joanna and I am the Mental Health Practitioner based in Woodside Primary. I work on behalf of Place2Be, a mental health charity that has over 25 years' experience working with

pupils, families and staff in UK schools. I offer a service called "Place2Talk" which is a fifteen-minute counselling drop in for children if they are wanting to have a chat about anything that is on their mind. Children are able to make an appointment to come and see me using the red letter boxes throughout the school

I also offer one to one intervention. This will happen after a child has specifically been referred for this from teachers or parents. Consent will always be needed from the parent before this service can take place. My room in the school is a quiet, safe space filled with various toys and art materials where the counselling intervention takes place.

Place2Be also offer "A Place for Parents" which is a counselling service specifically for parents/guardians. These sessions take place through my colleague Gillian Davidson. Gillian is doing her sessions from home during this current time, so this gives her the advantage of being incredibly flexible for clients.
