Primary1,4 and 7 National Assessments

As you may be aware, the Scottish Government has tasked schools to raise the attainment of all pupils supported by the National Improvement Framework. Currently, we are working with all our children in P1,4 and 7 to complete the Scottish

National Standardised online assessments as part of their daily work programme. Please do not panic! Our children do not have to revise or prepare for assessments. The system is designed to adapt so that if a child is experiencing difficulty the questions will get easier and if a child is doing well the questions will become more challenging. <u>There is no pass or fail.</u> Please remember that our teachers, through their day to day teaching, have a very good idea of how your child is progressing. The Scottish National Standardised Assessments are used to provide extra information for the teachers however, the teachers' professional judgment will always carry the most weight.
