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School Improvement Plan update

Our targets for this session are as follows:-

- Continue to ensure our curriculum design and learner pathways are fit for purpose.
- Introduce Talk4Writing non-fiction approach.
- Build a learning environment that is built upon positive, nurturing and appropriately challenging relationships.
- Continue to close our numeracy and literacy attainment gap and develop parental engagement.

So far we have.....

- Introduced new 'Star of the Week' certificates which highlight the 4 capacities, Successful Learners, Responsible Citizens, Effective Contributors and Confident Individuals.
- Class teachers linking learning experiences to the 4 capacities.
- All class teachers involved in working parties looking at our Health and Wellbeing, Technologies, PE planners and curriculum content.
- All staff participating in discussions regarding the creation of our Relationship Blueprint. School hand signal used by everyone, Woodie Walking introduced and class lines used by every teacher.
- Almost all parents consulted on our Relationship Blueprint via questionnaire at parental meeting.
- Recognition boards displaying clear targets visible in all classes.
- All Primary 1 pupils taken part in the SLC FLIPP programme for their phonics.
- All children requiring targeted supports for literacy /numeracy are timetabled.
- All children introduced to BSL greeting signs.
- All children introduced to the fact they have Rights.
- Targeted parental supports in place, through workshops and learning with child opportunities.
- **Coming soon...** Parental postcards home and consultation on our Anti Bullying policy.

<u>School Trips</u>—We have listened to your views regarding school trips. This year we will ensure every year group will go on a trip together. However, due to the size of our school, our year groups are large. This will mean a couple of buses or trips may happen over a couple of dates. There will be a charge for each trip, but we will try to keep this to a minimum to support our families where we can. Trips won't take place until later in the year and will be linked to your children's learning experiences in school.

As a staff we have all been trained on the



SLC's Attachment Strategy. This underpins our behaviour management strategies with the children in Woodside and we are using this to inform the work of our Relationship Blueprint. I have included the A-Z of 'Attachment' for parents to use. Please have a wee read. This is a useful resource, helping you to think about and understand the importance of how to communicate and behave towards your child to ensure they feel safe, happy and secure in life.



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Absence rates

We always monitor our absences across the school and will get in touch with you by letter if your **child's attendance rate drops** or if they are **often late** for school. We will be sending our letters out before the October holiday. Evelyn McGonagle, our Youth, Family and Community Learning Officer can support families to help improve attendance rates. The table below highlights the importance of being in school.

| 100% | 0 days missed | Best possible chance of success and reaching full potential |
|------|--------------------|---|
| 95% | 9 Days of Absence | 1 week and 4 days learning missed Is likely to make it harder to achieve full potential and secure the best possible outcomes |
| 90% | 19 days of Absence | 3 weeks and 4 days of learning missed |

85% 27 Days of Absence 5 weeks and 3 days of Learning Missed - Is likely to impact significantly on learning and progress which can lead to poorer outcomes in achievement, wellbeing and social development.

Outdoor Maths and Outdoor PE

As the weather now takes a turn it is really



important that you send your child to school with a waterproof jacket on. All our children are timetabled for a weekly

outdoor maths lesson, and most of our classes will participate in outdoor PE. We try out best to ensure our children get outdoors at break times and lunchtimes too, unless it is extremely wet! Please can I stress the importance of labelling all your child's school clothes as already our lost property is overflowing.

Any unclaimed items without names will be taken to our school clothing bank at the back of Sainsburys Local at the end of next week.

Equity Update
