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<u>Absence rates</u> We always monitor our absences across the school and will get in touch with you by letter if your child's rate drops or if they are often late for school. We will be sending out letters before the holidays. Evelyn McGonagle, our Youth, Family and Community Learning Officer can support families to improve attendance rates. The table below highlights the importance of being in school.

100%	0 days missed	
95%	<b>9 Days of Absence</b> 1 week and 4 days learning missed	
90%	<b>19 days of Absence</b> 3 weeks and 4 days of learning missed	
85%	<b>27 Days of Absence</b> 5 weeks and 3 days of Learning Missed Almost half a term missed
