School Improvement Plan update

Please find below a brief summary of the work we have been doing this session so far which is linked to our School Improvement Plan.

- All staff are continuing to embed skills into their teaching
- Staff have received training from SLC to enhance their knowledge of differentiation
- Our staff working party have evaluated and updated our school's technology curriculum and all teaching staff have received IT training during each In-Service day to enhance their knowledge and skills.
- We continue to focus on reducing our Numeracy, Reading and Writing gap through implementing targeted supports for groups of children.
- We continue to focus on school attendance, lettering children whose attendance is under 90%.
- We continue to work in partnership with Place2Be to provide supports for our targeted families and pupils.

This year we were allocated the sum of £121,275 as our Pupil Equity Fund. This money has now been used to purchase, extra teaching staff, extra Support Staff, Place2Be service, literacy, numeracy and ICT equipment.

5% of this budget, £6063.75 has been used to purchase resources and staffing for afterschool clubs.



Reading Schools Week

This week has been very busy as we have been participating in Reading Schools Week. Mrs Smith planned, loads of exciting activities for everyone including a Poetry Slam, Author Take over and a book treasure hunt. Mrs Smith, actively encourages all children and staff to be passionate about reading and she is currently gathering evidence for our GOLD School Reading Award. Keep reading everyone!



Children's Mental Health Week—9th Feb

In partnership with Place2Be, we have been focussing on **Children's Mental Health Week**, The theme this year is "**This is my place**". In class our children will explore what it means feeling like you're part of something, such as your family, your school, your group of friends or a team. Article 17 (access to information from the media)
