

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School Improvement Plan update

Our targets for this session are as follows:-



- Enhance our curriculum by focussing on skills development,
 Sustainability and working towards the accreditation of our Silver Rights Respecting Schools Award.
- Introduce a 'Teach, Target, Play' approach in Primary 1 for maths and numeracy.
- Develop a 'Learning, Teaching and Assessment' policy to ensure consistency across the school.
- Continue to reduce our Numeracy, Reading and Writing gap.
- Continue to focus on school attendance.
- Continue to work in partnership with Place2Be and our Youth, Family and Community Learning Officer to provide supports for our targeted families and pupils.

In Woodside, so far this year

- All teaching staff have received input on the SLC Skills framework and the Skills working group are looking at the resources to support staff.
- All P5,P6 and P7 pupils (next week) will participate in an online 'Climate Ready Classroom' session from Keep Scotland Beautiful.
- Introduced Children's Rights of the Month and shared our at Rights
 Assemblies and with our parents in our Newsletter. These are displayed in each classroom.
- Our Primary 1 classes have introduced play during numeracy lessons.
- Teaching staff have evaluated our current learning, teaching and assessment approaches and parental ideas were gathered at our recent Parent Council meeting. Our staff working group have started to evaluate these.
- Teaching staff have received input on Assessment from SLC.
- Targeted support groups for literacy and numeracy have been timetabled and you will have received a note home if your child is participating in these.
- Place2Be has begun sessions with identified children.

School Trips—Last year we made a few changes to the organisation of our school trips, after taking on board your comments. We will continue to ensure every year group goes on a trip together. This will mean a couple of buses or trips may happen over a couple of dates. After consultation with our Parent Council, there will be a charge of £5 for each the class trip. Trips won't take place until later in the year and will be linked to your children's learning experiences in school. We want to give you plenty of time to manage this payment so a letter will come out next week with more information.

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Absence rates

We know and understand that ill health and injuries do happen but we always monitor our absences across the school and will get in touch with you by letter if your child's attendance rate drops below 90% or if they are often late for school.

We will be sending our letters out before the October holiday. Evelyn McGonagle, our Youth, Family and Community Learning Officer can support families to help improve attendance rates.
