

<u>Absence rates</u> We always monitor our absences across the school and will get in touch with you by letter if your <u>child's rate drops below 90%</u> or if they are <u>often late</u> for school. We will be sending out letters before the holidays. Evelyn McGonagle, our Youth, Family and Community Learning Officer can support families to improve attendance rates. The table below highlights the importance of being in school.

100%	0 days missed	Best possible chance of success and reaching full potential
95%	9 Days of Absence 1 week and 4 days learning missed	Is likely to make it harder to achieve full potential and secure the best possible outcomes
90%	19 days of Absence 3 weeks and 4 days of learning missed	
85%	27 Days of Absence 5 weeks and 3 days of Learning Missed Almost half a term missed	Is likely to impact significantly on learning and progress which can lead to poorer outcomes in achievement, wellbeing and social and emotional development
80%	36 days of Absence 7 weeks and 3 days of learning missed
