Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy New Year everyone. Welcome to our first newsletter of 2025! I hope you all had a fantastic festive break and enjoyed the special time with your children and families.

We are back and ready for another busy term!

It was fantastic to see so many Mums, Dads, Aunts, Uncles and Grandparents at our Open Morning at the end of November when **73%** of our pupils had a visitor on the day. Thank you for coming along as I appreciate its not always easy escaping from work or commitments. Your feedback was highly positive and I will share some of your comments over the page.

Of the 248 parents who responded to our questionnaire :-

- **100%** stated that their child was able to 'teach me' how to learn.
- 100% stated the tasks let them see how their child learns in school.
- **100%** now have ideas on how to support their child at home.

On the run up to Christmas many of our children were coming to school wearing casual and designer clothing. Please can I highlight **the importance of wearing school uniform**. It keeps everything equitable, ensuring everyone looks the same and are part of Team Woodie. Not wearing uniform can also

impact on behaviour at times with some children. If you require extra uniform we have a massive supply of preloved pieces so either drop by or give the office a phone. I would really appreciate your support with this as we are all really proud of our children. Our playground becomes a mud pit in the winter months so we would appreciate if



all our children could bring a change of shoes for indoors to keep our Gym Hall and school building clean.

I also need to stress the importance of attending school and being at school for **9am**. We have a number of children arriving late every morning and they are missing out in vital learning. Thanks you for your support with this.

A big 'Thank You' to all the parents who have already paid £5 towards their child's school trip. Every stage will participate in an educational outing over the next few months. Primary 3 have already had a fab outing to New Lanark and P6 are off the Scottish Parliament soon.

Article 28 (Right to Education)
